CENTRAL AVENUE, UMATILLA, LAKE COUNTY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

3) Agreement for Impact Fee Installments – Williams, 38151 Church Street
Finance Director Rogers gave the background information on the request for water impact fee installments. The fees plus interest will be billed monthly along with the utility usage.
Attorney Kevin Stone provided a Water Impact Agreement outlining conditions of the Staff recommends approval.
Discussion focused on the requirement for a backflow preventer with Councilmember Purvis stating on a home a residential dual check is required. Staff will modify the agreement if it is not needed and a dual check can be used.

There has to be intent as to what would be done with the property.

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Finance Director Rogers noted when the budget was prepared there were no specific grant requests identified for the CRA funds budgeted. It is important to have a plan to use the funds. This year there is \$100,000 in the budget. We did not pursue a big capital plan because of the uncertainty of the vote on the penny sales tax and the change in the City Manager position.

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City Clerk Howard said there are no pending CRA applications.

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Council member Wright stated she believed the city would regret not purchasing the property in the future. She noted the corner has become a hazard which needs to be cleaned up and developed as an entrance to Cadwell Park.
