2 Ordinance 2018 – A, Airport Fees, First Reading

City Manager Blankenship we have 3 new hangars and a walk through this new hangars are larger we have an apartment that has had work done Staff recommends adjusting the lease rates on the airport apartments and establishing an overnight vehicle parking charge of \$2 per night.

3 Resolution 2018 – 08 Special Assessments on FRIM Notice

City Attorney Stone read the resolution by title:

RESOLUTION 2018 - 08

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF UMATILLA, FLORIDA, ELECTING TO USE THE NON-AD VALOREM SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS ON THE TRIM NOTICE; PROVIDING FOR LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT; PROVIDING FOR AUTHORITY TO THE CITY MANAGER FOR IMPLEMENTING ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIONS;

PROVIDING TRANSMISSION OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE LAKE COUNTY TAX COLLECTOR AND LAKE COUNTY PROPERTY APPRAISER; PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

City Manager Blankenship said this allows the city to enter into agreements with the property appraiser's office related to the proposed fire assessment. This is for the process only; no fire assessment fees have been approved at this time.

Attachment A is an agreement to include the city's assessment as a part of the TRIM notice instead of paying to individually mail the notice to all property owners within the city, saving the city a considerable amount of money.

NEW BUSINESS

4 BESH Proposal – Smoke Testing and Lift Station Generator Design Project

City Manager Blankenship noted the BESH proposal is for the engineering work related to the \$500,000 REDI grant awarded to the city. The proposal covers development and implementation of a sewer smoke testing program and the design, bidding and construction administration services for the installation of emergency generators of three lift stations.

Public Works Director Mercer said it is anticipated the smoke test will uncover some issues. Depending on the repair cost, we may not have the funds to purchase three generators.

<u>MOTION by Olson; SECOND by Purvis; to award contract to BESH Engineering for</u> <u>\$42,000 for REDI Project – Smoke Testing, Repairs, Lift Station Generator Design. Motion</u> <u>carried.</u>
