**SUBJECT: Gateway Commerce Park** 

**ISSUE: Preliminary Plat Approval** 

BACKGROUND SUMMARY: The Gateway Commerce Park is a 41-acre Planned Unit Development Industrial Park previously known as "Duck Box Properties" and is located at the corner of SR 19 and Mills Street. The Council approved the PUD Zoning through the adoption of Ordinance 2020-B and the Future Land Use Designation of Industrial via Ordinance 2019-L.

The Applicant is Duck Box Properties, LLC, Scott Purvis, Owner who along with BESH Engineering and Land Planning Group has submitted an application for the Gateway Commerce Park Preliminary Plat. The Preliminary Plat consists of 11 Lots, abutting a private non-City maintained internal road. The plan provides detailed lot dimensions, buffers, setbacks, stormwater areas, environmental assessment, geotechnical report, and polyvinyl coated chain link perimeter fencing consistent with the approved IPUD Master Plan and Developers Agreement.

A landscape plan was also submitted and it was found to meet the City's Land Development Code requirements, however, during the Council meeting to approve the IPUD Ordinance 2020-B, the Applicant stated the development would plant Florida Eucalyptus plants that grow quickly and will provide a visual buffer and serve to help attenuate sound adjacent to the residential lots along Jim Dougherty Drive. The current landscape plan does not list Florida Eucalyptus in the planting list.

A lighting plan has been submitted showing the street lighting photometrics meeting the City's LDR requirements, however, the applicant has indicated that he will use wooden light poles. The City LDRs don't specifically state the type of pole material. Because the photometric plan must be approved the City, the staff would recommend the applicant install concrete or metal poles.

As required by the IPUD Developers Agreement, the applicant will update the traffic study to determine if additional traffic related improvements are required. Currently, the study was completed and submitted to the Lake-Sumter MPO, but their review has not been completed at the time of this staff report. Staff would recommend that if the Council approves this Preliminary Plat, they do so with a condition that any improvements required from the Traffic Study will executed with the approval of the subdivision construction plans.



Landscape and Irrigation Plan


