MINUTES

Chair Adcock called the meeting to order at 5:54 p.m.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. Closure of Lakeside Avenue (located behind City Hall)

Scott Blankenship, City Manager, stated this project was identified as part of a development plan several years ago at which time there was a maintenance building, a vacant lot and a house right behind City Hall. Since that time, the City has purchased those two properties. A copy of the concept plan was displayed for the City Council and meeting attendees. Staff is looking to receive direction from the City Council with regard to moving forward.

Mr. Blankenship said this project would be a very appropriate use of the property, expanding Cadwell Park to serve citizens of Umatilla.

Chair Adcock asked if community input is necessary and Mr. Blankenship stated there was community input when the concept plan was initiated. He said the concept needs to be revisited because currently the intersection of Cassady and Lakeview is not safe.

Mr. Blankenship asked for authorization to obtain some preliminary engineering in order to determine how to move forward with development of the concept plan. Preliminary engineering would be a key component and staff could obtain information based on current transportation guidelines to make sure the preliminary look meets necessary requirements.

Mr. Butler would like to see the Chamber building removed and he said a new building could be considered and would be eligible for CRA funding.

The CRA Board directed Mr. Blankenship to move forward with obtaining estimates for preliminary engineering to be presented to City Council for approval.

Chris Tyree, 295 Lakeside Avenue, stated he has followed this plan as a resident and is interested in seeing the City make changes to the area.

Mr. Blankenship stated again that staff will explore the possibility of using CRA funding for public safety services within the CRA areas of the City.

Mr. Blankenship asked Regina Frazier, Finance Director, to explain how CRA funding may be used and she provided that information.

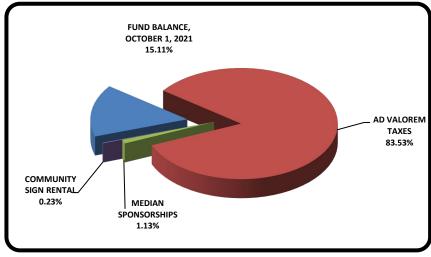

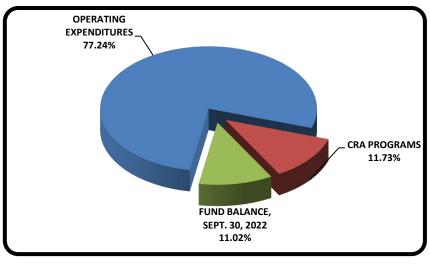
