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### Overview

In 1997 the Umatilla City Council established a Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) in accordance with the Community Redevelopment Act of 1969, implementing a Community Redevelopment Plan to remove the conditions of slum and blight that existed within a large portion of the city.

The Umatilla City Council serves as the CRA Board.

The Programs and Compliance Manager provides grant presentations to the CRA Board and the Finance Director oversees the CRA Budget and allocation of such.

The City Manager and several City departments including Public Works and Finance actively engage in planning and implementing project activities that are designed to revitalize and restore blighted areas. The City of Umatilla's Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) is dedicated to revitalizing and enhancing the economic, social, and environmental conditions within the designated redevelopment area. This report provides an overview of the CRA's progress, financial status, and future initiatives.

### Accomplishments

#### Matching Façade Grants

Three commercial façade grants were awarded to businesses committed to doing their part to keep Umatilla beautiful.

The Palm Mansion – 110 N Trowell Avenue \$11,211.00 50/50 Match

The Palm Mansion is an historic residence in the heart of Umatilla. Built in 1904 by citrus grower Robert Lee Collins, the house remained in the care of his family for over 100 years. The house was recently converted into a picturesque wedding venue. Improvements included paint, conversion of a small orange grove to a grass parking lot with handicap access, landscape, irrigation and lower-level porch railings for safety, and a ramp for ADA compliance.

### Streetscape and Wayfinding

Public Works replaced the basic square steel stop sign hardware with the more aesthetically pleasing black hardware, to include round poles, stop sign frames and pole caps along three more commonly traveled roads in the City. As staffing and time allows, the replacements will continue.

#### Median Maintenance and Tree Trimming

Regular median maintenance and tree trimming are essential for roadway safety, aesthetics, and environmental health. Well-maintained medians enhance visibility for drivers, reducing the risk of accidents caused by overgrown vegetation obstructing sightlines. Proper tree trimming prevents branches from falling onto roads, protecting both motorists and pedestrians. Additionally, trimmed and healthy trees contribute to urban beautification and air quality by absorbing pollutants and providing shade. Investing in these maintenance efforts ensures safer, cleaner, and more attractive roadways for everyone.







### Outlook

The Umatilla CRA has the potential to benefit from increases in residential and commercial development, especially along the commercial corridors and the Downtown area. Industrial growth will also bolster job availability and provide patronage to City businesses. The Board along with staff will continue to take advantage of opportunities to promote Umatilla as a more rural destination in Central Florida where you can raise a family or just enjoy a break from the hustle and bustle while just a short drive from urban conveniences.

Updating the Umatilla Redevelopment Plan - An update of the Plan will be completed to renew the vision of Nature's Hometown. With the assistance of the Board and City administration, the Umatilla CRA is prepared and looking forward to having an optimistic future. It is the intent of the City to get a CRA extension for an additional 30 years upon the 2026 sunset.

Projects on the horizon include land acquisition for an interactive fountain or splash pad, expansion of the North Lake Trail through town, and added parking for downtown businesses to provide easy access to some exciting new businesses and restaurants opening in the heart of Umatilla. We will continue to incentivize the rehabilitation of older businesses with our matching Façade Grant Program and will double down by adding residential façade grants with the coming update. Under our new leadership, we seek to grow and transform the City of Umatilla in a positive way and hope to show that "Big Things Happen in Little Umatilla!"
